Please use only Panasonic R03P (Ni-MH) batteries and charge the batteries for about 7 hours before initial use.

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

#### ◆ Registration

Your PS (Portable Station) must be registered in the Business Telephone System and you have to determine the extension number before initial use.






### Before Operating the PS

TALK Button:

Used to make or receive calls.

Joystick

Used to adjust the ringer/receiver volume, select the Function mode and the function displayed directly above, and move the cursor to select a desired item.

SPEAKERPHONE Button:
Used for the hands-free

conversation. Press TALK button to return to the receiver.

R RECALL Button:

Used to disconnect the current call and make another call without hanging up, or answer Call Waiting from the telephone company.

(INT) INTERCOM Button:

Used to make or receive intercom calls.

CLEAR/TRANSFER Button:

Used to clear digits or characters, or transfer a call to another party.

**CANCEL/POWER** Button:



Used to end calls, exit the Phonebook or Function mode, or turn on/off the PS.

Soft Buttons:

Used to select the function displayed directly above each button. Functions displayed depend on the state of use.



### Before Operating the PS

#### **♦** Battery Installation

Insert the batteries as shown. The negative  $\bigcirc$  end should be inserted first. Close the cover as indicated by the arrow.





 $\bullet$  When you replace the batteries, the positive  $\oplus$  end should be removed first.

#### ◆ Battery Charge

At the time of shipment, the batteries are not charged. Please charge the batteries for about 7 hours before initial use.






- When the battery has been completely charged, the charge indicator will change from red to green. Refer to "Battery Information" on page 46.
- It is normal for the PS and charger to feel warm while the battery is charging.
- Keep devices sensitive to magnetic fields away from the charger.


#### Power On/Off





• When the PS is turned on, it will be in standby mode. Standby mode is the state of the PS when it is not performing any operations and is awaiting calls.



### Before Operating the PS

#### **Operation Outline**

Functions of the PS are accessed through the display menu, and selected with the joystick and soft keys. The guidance display is shown in standby mode for easy operation.





- You cannot toggle the displays while in key lock mode or while the PS is on a charger.
- You can select whether the guidance display is shown or not. (See page 37.)



### Before Operating the PS

#### PBX Feature Menu

Functions of the PS can be activated through the display key list. Move the joystick left to display the key list.





#### Pause:

Inserts a dialling pause.



#### FWD/DND:

Sets Call Forwarding or Do Not Disturb.



#### Message:

Used to leave a message waiting indication or call back the party who left you a message waiting indication.



#### Search Wave:

Searches the strongest radio signal coming from the Cell Station.




#### PBX Program:

Enters the PBX programming mode.

### Flexible Key Display

A flexible key can be used either to seize a line in order to make or receive an outside call (F-CO key), or used as a function key. Move the Joystick right to display the flexible key list. The icon shown beside each F-CO key indicates line status similarly to the LED indicators on a Proprietary Telephone; • is the same as a green LED; • is the same as a red LED.

#### Example:



#### Understanding the icons for the F-CO key\*

- (on): You are currently using this line.
- ;● (flashing rapidly): You have an incoming call on this line.
- (flashing slowly): You have a call on hold on this line.
- $\bigcirc$  (on): This line is in use by someone else.
- : (flashing rapidly): There is an incoming call received by an incoming call distribution group to which "Ring" is set as the group call distribution method.
- (flashing slowly): Someone has a call on hold on this line. (no icon): This line is idle.



- \* The meanings of these icons vary depending on the status of the CO line.



#### Handset Phonebook


You can store up to 200 items with names, phone numbers and category numbers in the handset for easy access. All directory items are stored in alphabetical order.

#### ◆ Incoming Call Identification

You can organise entries in the Handset Phonebook into one of 9 categories. A call from someone stored in one of these categories will be indicated by the ringer type, light (LED) colour pattern assigned to the category.

#### **Entering Characters**

You can enter characters and digits using the dialling buttons. You can select one of 5 character modes by pressing the **Right Soft Key** while entering a name. The function icon above the soft key displays the current character mode.

### Using the Phonebook

Example: To enter "Anne" in Normal Mode.





- To enter a character located on the same dialling button as the previous character, move the cursor by moving the Joystick , then enter the desired character.
- If you enter a different character by mistake, move the Joystick to highlight the character, press to delete it, then enter the correct character.

## **♦** Walkie-Talkie

Using Walkie-Talkie mode, you can communicate with another handset even when out of range of a base unit. Only Panasonic DECT Portable Station which supports Walkie-Talkie can be used. Handsets have to be in Walkie-Talkie mode, and have the same Walkie-Talkie group number. In Walkie-Talkie mode, you cannot make or receive a call through the PBX.

# Troubleshooting

## **Troubleshooting**

You cannot dial.	The number which you dialled is restricted by the Business Telephone System.     → Consult your dealer. ### Replacing the Batteries

If " L " flashes after a few telephone calls even when the batteries have been fully charged, it is time to replace the batteries with new ones.

Before replacing the batteries, turn the power off to prevent memory loss. Replace the batteries. Charge the new batteries for at least 7 hours.

If you replace the batteries before the low battery warning appears, the battery strength icon may display an incorrect reading. In this case, use the PS as normal with the new batteries installed. When the low battery warning is displayed, charge the batteries for about 7 hours. The battery strength icon will then display a correct reading.

Batteries, due to their construction, undergo some wear and tear. The lifetime of a battery also depends on correct maintenance. Charging and discharging are the most important factors. You should take notice of the following to maintain the life of the battery as long as possible.

Ni-MH batteries have a kind of memory, the "memory effect." If fully charged batteries are used several times only for 15 minutes in the handset and then recharged, the capacity of the batteries will be reduced to 15 minutes due to the memory effect. Therefore you should discharge the batteries completely, i.e. use them in the handset until " on the display starts flashing. Then recharge them as described in the manual. After the memory effect has occurred, it is possible to achieve almost complete capacity of the Ni-MH batteries by charging and discharging several times one after another.

Ni-MH batteries can also self-discharge. This self-discharge depends on the ambient temperature. At temperatures under 0  $^{\circ}$ C, the self-discharge will be the lowest. High humidity and high temperatures support the self-discharge. Also long-term storage will lead to self-discharge. A dead Ni-MH battery should not be disposed of normally. They contain toxic heavy metal hydride and therefore should be recycled.

### Safety Instructions

Pay special attention to the safety suggestions listed below.

### Safety

- Power source: The AC adaptor should be connected to a power supply only of the type as marked on the AC adaptor. The AC adaptor is used as the main disconnect device, ensure that the AC outlet is located/installed near the unit and is easily accessible.
- 2) Non use periods: When the PS is not being used, turn the power off. When left unused for a long period of time, the charger should be unplugged from the AC outlet.
- 3) Do not place metal items such as coins or rings on the charger. As they become hot, you might get burned if you touch them.

### **Environment**

- 1) Water and moisture: Do not use the PS and the charger near water for example, near a bathtub, washbowl, sink, etc. Damp basements should also be avoided.

### **Operating Range**

- The range of operation depends on the topography of your office, weather or usage conditions, because signals are transmitted between the Cell Station (CS) and the PS by radio waves.
